Dear Parents / Carers,

A quick reminder that the whole school are at **Warwick Castle** for the day tomorrow. The coach is leaving at 9am, so all children will need to be in school at 8.45am. Please check the list provided to ensure that your child has all that they need for the day. Thank you to those parents who are helping on the visit – please arrive at school around 8.30am.

Our **Year 6 children have their night's camp** tomorrow evening as well on the school field. Please return your child to school at 6.30pm - fed and watered- and with everything that they need for the overnight stay. Children should be collected at 10am on Saturday morning. Parents may use the gate at the bottom of the school field to drop children off on Friday evening and collect on Saturday morning.

Your child should have brought home their **summer report** for parents to view today. Please do check school bags to ensure that this has not been missed. As Class 4 are out of school today they will bring home their reports tomorrow.

We have been enjoying hearing Class 4 rehearse their **end of term sketch show** in school recently and are delighted to be able to invite Class 4 parents the opportunity to view the show on Monday afternoon at 1.30pm. We will be performing the sketches on the school field and if parents could let the office know if they are attending it will help us to know how many chairs to put out. Refreshments will be served by the children.

Advance notice for all children who will be in **Class 3 in the Autumn** (Years 3 and 4): we are starting **swimming lessons** again and the whole class will attend lessons on Tuesday mornings from the second week back from the 14th September. Parents will be requested to drop children off at the pool at 8.50am but we have booked a coach for return to school travel. These lessons will continue for 12 weeks. More details will be sent out in due course.

Please be aware that even though the government has announced that schools do not need to operate COVID restrictions from the 19th July, Warwickshire County Council have recommended that we continue with staggered starts, pick up and bubbles until the end of term. We want to ensure that families get to enjoy the start of the summer holidays without any need to isolate and trust that parents will understand this decision.

WARWICKSHIRE LOCAL WELFARE SCHEME

The council's Local Welfare Scheme continues to help our most vulnerable residents at times of unavoidable crisis when they have no other means of help and can provide financial support and advice for people in crisis who need support to access food and utilities. The scheme also signposts to further support available from other public, community and voluntary services around the county.

The Government recently announced that the COVID Local Support Grant would be extended for one final time beyond the planned ending of restrictions, to help families get back on their feet as the economy recovers and the vaccine rollout continues. Additional funding has been allocated to every Council to support families with children, other vulnerable households and individuals to ensure that people who are struggling have the support they need for food, essential items, and utilities.

Families will be supported by an advisor when they contact the Welfare Scheme who will discuss their circumstances and provide appropriate help to address their situation where eligible.
