Read lots of stories and if you can, join your local library. Look out for some of our recommended reads.



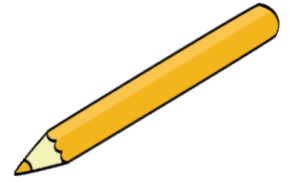

Have a water fight in your garden. Blow bubbles and pop them!

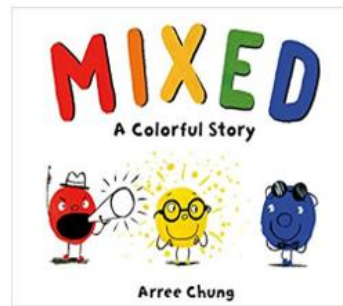
